Principal's message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last week we celebrated Education Week here at school. Although it looked a little different this year we still managed to celebrate it in style.

We began our celebrations with STEM activity rotations where students visited each classroom in their peer support group and participated in a range of activities that demonstrated how successfully we can learn together.

On Wednesday we had a World of Maths incursion where students engaged in a variety of mathematical activities that tested their problem-solving skills. It was great to see the persistence and determination demonstrated by our students as they worked together to complete each activity.

On Friday we concluded our Education Week celebrations with our school assembly. This was the first assembly we have been able to have this year where we could present students with their honours awards. Congratulations to everyone who received an award at this assembly. Unfortunately, our athletics carnival had to be postponed as a result of the weather.

As you are well aware all excursions are currently on hold. Our Stage 2 and Stage 3 camp is scheduled for Term 4. We will be keeping these bookings in anticipation that they will be able to go ahead next term. In order to help you prepare for these camps the details of each are as follows:

Stage 2 – Brewongle overnight camp Thursday 29 October – Friday 30 October. Approximate cost \$200

Stage 3 – Point Wolstoncroft Sport and Recreation Centre Wednesday 4 November – Friday 6 November. Approximate cost \$380.

Over the last 4 weeks we have been focusing on the following learner characteristics:

Resourceful – being ready, willing and able to learn in different ways. An active learner is someone who is involved in the learning process. They take part in discussions, ask questions, contribute their ideas, discuss what they have learnt with others, ask for help when they are unsure and collaborate effectively with others.

Self-aware – aware of their own actions and the environment around them. They make honest and accurate judgements and take responsibility for their own actions. They use mistakes as a valuable learning opportunity to improve.

Resilience – ability to cope when things go wrong. Resilience can be described as bouncing back, dealing with challenges, holding your head up, giving things a go and trying your best, standing up for yourself and being able to cope with what life throws at you.

Please continue to remind your child/ children about social distancing and to inform you or their teacher if they are feeling unwell. Any child who is unwell will be sent home from school. Keep yourself updated with the latest information about the departments response to COVID-19 by following this link <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/covid-19</u>.

In addition to these infection control measures, we are requesting that any cakes or goodies brought in the help celebrate children's birthdays are purchased from a shop and not homemade.


School photos


