Principal's message

Dear Parents and Carers,

The students here at Comleroy Road have been working really hard this term in their learning and have been demonstrating the characteristics of an effective learner in the classroom and in the playground.

- Kindergarten have been learning how to write effective sentences, enjoying following a procedure to plant plants in the garden at our front entry and have had a lot of fun eating what they have made. In mathematics students have been practising their counting on and back strategies.
- Year 1 have shown fantastic improvement in their reading over the course of this term with many students already achieving the expected level for a student at the end of Year 1. They have learnt how to use the split strategy to solve more complex addition problems.
- 2/3G have worked exceptionally well collaborating as a team to create eye catching advertisements to encourage healthy eating at our school canteen. They are currently learning about sustainability and how we can make a difference at our school.
- 3/4B have demonstrated impressive results in their ability to recall their multiplication facts with many students smashing their goals this term. They have learnt that using feedback can improve their work and are developing their capacity to provide targeted feedback to their peers.
- Students in Stage 3 have been learning about Australian landmarks and persuasive texts. They have been looking closely at animals in captivity and supporting their arguments with evidence.

Over the last 4 weeks we have been focusing on the following learner characteristics:

Reflective – A reflective learner thinks about their own learning and experiences. They know what they do well and where they can improve. A reflective learning can look back in order to grow forwards. Encourage your children to reflect on what they learnt at school each day and ask them how they would do it differently next time.

Inquisitive – Inquisitive learners are life long learners. They set themselves challenging learning goals and ask lots of questions so they can improve. An inquisitive learner seeks feedback from others often. Encourage your children to tell you the goals they have set for reading, writing, mathematics and/or their personal goals. Ask them questions about what they wrote about, read about or learnt about in mathematics.

Risk taker – being a risk taker means that you have the confidence to try new thing, even if they are challenging. Risk takers know that it is OK to make a mistake and that mistakes help us learn. We can all take risks by having a go and not giving up until we have achieved our goal.

Please continue to remind your child/children about social distancing and to inform you or their teacher if they are feeling unwell. Any child who is unwell will be sent home from school. We are encouraging anyone who is unwell with flu like symptoms to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics. You will need to provide a copy of the negative test result or doctors certificate and be symptom free before being permitted to return to school. In addition to these infection control measures, we are requesting that any cakes or goodies brought in the help celebrate children’s birthdays are purchased from a shop and not homemade.

Cyber Safety

Yesterday we had the Police Youth Liaison Office visit our school to highlight the importance of cyber safety with students from years 3-6. Students were educated on the importance of keeping their accounts private and not sharing personal information online. They also learnt about their digital shadow - whatever is posted online cannot be removed or deleted. It will be there forever, even if they were the ones who deleted it.

“Everything you post on social media will stay there FOREVER and even if you hit that delete button it’s still there somewhere. Now employers look at your social media accounts and your posts.” **Josh and Riley**

“Definitely don’t post a photo with secret information and things that are inappropriate online.” **Ella and Shania**

“If something is inappropriate or not right report it, block it and tell a trusted adult. It is very important to always stay safe online. We also learnt about your digital shadow, a thing that is left online and cannot be deleted or removed.” **Jess and Maja**

“Today we learnt that what you wouldn’t say to them in person, don’t say it online. We also learnt that you should never share your information and where you live.” **Charlie and Hunter**

“One main thing we learnt was if you don’t know them offline, don’t talk to them online.” **Caitlin and Kalypso**

Behaviour code for students

NSW public schools

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

In NSW public schools students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- Follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- Strive for the highest standards in learning
- Respect all members of the school community and show courtesy to all students, teachers and community members
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- Comply with the school's uniform policy or dress code
- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour Code for Students: Actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity
- Speak and behave courteously
- Cooperate with others
- Develop positive and respectful relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others
- Dress appropriately by complying with the school uniform or dress code
- Take care with property

Safety

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

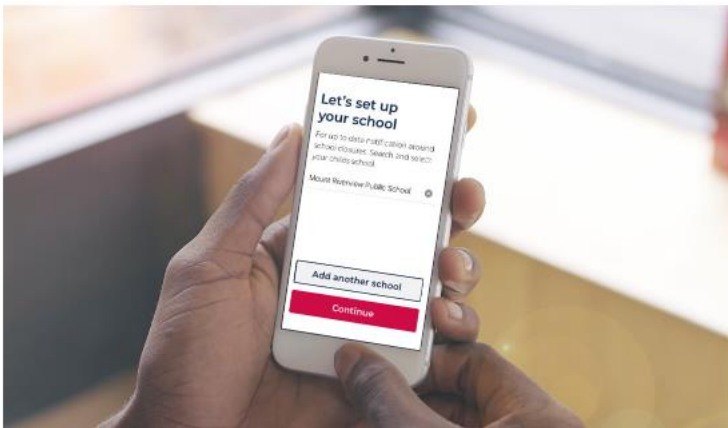
