In Term 3, 4/5M chose an area of interest to research and teach the class about. These passion projects allowed students to gain a deeper understanding of an area that they are passionate about. Students selected from a range of topics, including sport, motor vehicles, world wars, baking and important figures from history, to name just a few.

As part of this process, students had to research their area and present this in their chosen way. Some students created dioramas, did a baking demonstration, created a video or presented a slideshow.

Students demonstrated creativity, inquisitiveness and taught the class a great a many interesting and varied things.











How blanks and blocks help us write

After engaging with professional learning from Training 24/7, we started implementing "Blanks" and "Blocks" as a part of our writing units this year. They are types of scaffolds to support our students in developing their understanding of how to structure their writing.

The blanks are used as a scaffold for the oral construction of sentences and as a prompt for writing. They are not cloze passages. A blank does not signify a single word needs to be placed there. A blank stands for anything that makes sense grammatically. This is a powerful tool for differentiation.

Lower students might only manage 1 word, more capable students may use short or longer phrases. The emphasis in Stage 1 is writing ACCURATE sentences. The blanks are removed towards the end of units.




How a Kindergarten student used the "Blank" for their writing.




Blocks

"Blocks" (see below) are less scaffolded and provide students with a general idea of what they could write about in each paragraph. Throughout a unit of work, students focus on one paragraph at time. This enables them to slowly build on their idea and refine it.
